# **Other News:**

From Ruins to Resurrection – by Ashish Thomas Philip. A Reflection on Pilgrimage for All Ages held on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> July.

On the 5th of July, I joined a pilgrimage to visit a number of "ruined" churches scattered across the north of Coventry (seven, in total), intending to explore the heritage of these churches and to find hope in the stories of reconstruction and resurrection.

Each one of the several accounts I heard had similar elements to them – the destruction brought about by the war, the bravery and devotion that the respective communities showed to save their sacred spaces and their persistence to rebuild and continue worship against all odds. The churches were also unique in their "flavours" of faith, with each rebuilding and finding its niche in the diversity of the church. Even in this diversity, they reflected their faithfulness to God and their trust in Him, shared by each member of the community and by me. I returned home that day with an encouraging thought even in the darkest of times, even when things look bleak, we can trust in God to keep us going on our journeys from ruin to resurrection.


