

Sermon series for October 2025: A Christian look at the Environment

There's growing concern about the environment, climate change, sustainability and our part in it, for good and bad. The Church of England is committed to achieving a demanding target of Net-Zero status by 2030. Our response includes thinking Biblically about God's creation, our role in God's mandate of stewardship, and determining how we can 'make that key difference': for example, in serving refreshments are they fairtrade or ethically sourced? in meeting in person how are people getting there most eco-friendly?

For 4 Sundays in October, we will begin to look at what the Bible says and how we might challenge ourselves to 'make that key difference':

Covid and Flu Vaccination Clinic - Sunday 5th October at 12pm

Jane Williams and Julie Bain who are Registered Nurses and members of the Cathedral congregation are running a Flu and Covid vaccination clinic from 12 noon on Sunday 5th October 2025. Any members of Holy Trinity Church who meet the criteria below are welcome to attend. The clinic will be held in the John Laing Centre in the Cathedral.

The criteria for receiving the Autumn Covid vaccination are the same as this year's Spring booster.

All people over 75 or patients who are acutely immunosuppressed.

If you had it in the Spring, you can have it in the Autumn!

For the Flu vaccine all those over 65 years of age.

The groups eligible for flu vaccination in the 2025 to 2026 flu season from 1 October 2025 include: those aged 65 years and over (including those who are 64 but will be 65 on or before 31 March 2026) those aged 18 years to under 65 years in clinical risk groups. If you have had it before and you are under 65 then you are likely to be eligible this year.

Mission Focus, September 2025: Coffee Tots

Coffee Tots is a Christian organisation which helps parents to be more joyful and confident in raising their children, especially when they are finding the task lonely or challenging. It is based within the Wave Waterpark café, and many people from Holy Trinity have worked or volunteered with them. Staff and volunteers offer love, support and friendship while encouraging the parents to play, read and engage with their children, to improve the parent/child relationship as well as the child's development. Sessions are also held to help parents with issues such as relationship breakdown, poor mental or physical health, financial struggles or domestic violence. Coffee Tots received the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service in 2016. We will have an update at the morning services on Sept 14th.
