Saturday Recital on November 15th with Joseph Frost-Tesfaye at 12.15pm & Tom McEwen Trio - at 1.00pm



A warm 'Welcome back!' to Holy Trinity for Tom McEwan who was a member of Holy Trinity 9:30 Music Group for 10 years before being awarded a place on Leeds Conservatoire's Jazz Performance and Improvisation Degree Course.

Tom will present live tracks from his debut album "The Three Forests". This is a beautifully raw snapshot of the young guitarist's contemporary folk-jazz sound; self-recorded and produced over the course of 2 sessions at home in Leeds. Joined by drummer Herbie Underwood and bassist Joe Wilkes (Awen Ensemble, Yaatri), the groups fiery interplay blossoms into new territory as the release unfolds, comprising of 6 original compositions exploring themes of nature and childhood nostalgia.

Today he is delighted to be performing a solo piano set, blending open improvisation with much loved standards and original compositions.

Helping to manage and oversee church services, so that all run smoothly



Mission Focus, November 2025: The Light House Christian Care Ministry



The Light House Christian Care Ministry was founded by Coventry Christians in 1986, to provide counselling for people from across the region, aiming for it to be affordable even for those with limited financial means. They provide a safe, non-judgemental space of acceptance and empathetic understanding for those over 18 years of age, with a team of professional staff counsellors and associate volunteer counsellors. They train student counsellors and also have volunteers doing admin, fundraising, or practical tasks around their base in Ball Hill.

They help people with anxiety, stress, depression, attempted suicide, relationship difficulties, bereavement, addictions, and those with a history of abuse. We find a good take-up of their leaflets from the Jesus Chapel in HTC, where people in distress often spend time in prayer. A member of their team will visit HTC on Sunday November 16th to tell us more about their work. Our financial support for them has enabled them to continue to operate in challenging times.




